

Anti-Bullying Policy

Definition

Bullying is an act of aggression which involves:

- a desire to hurt
- hurtful action (can be physical, verbal, gestures or exclusion)
- a power imbalance
- repetition
- an unjust use of power
- evident enjoyment by the aggressor
- a sense of being oppressed on the part of the victim
- Bullying is a behaviour and will never be used to label a person

Aim

The Preschool is committed to provide all staff and students with a working and learning environment free from all forms of bullying including racial, religious, physical and sexual. All students, staff and families are required to respect and abide by this commitment.

Strategies

- Staff will address the issues around bullying behaviour with the children in age appropriate ways, by using stories and role-playing.
- If bullying behaviour occurs both the aggressor and the victim will be supported appropriately.
- Children and families are encouraged to report any concerns about bullying behaviour.
- Incidents of bullying behaviour will be managed as per the Behaviour Guidance Policy and Procedures
- Staff will be responsible for responding promptly to any issues around bullying behaviour.
- If bullying behaviour is identified, both the family of the aggressor and victim should be notified. Refer to Communicating with Families Policy
- Refer to Extreme Behaviours Procedure if required.
- If families report concerns regarding bullying behaviour action will be taken to address the behaviour and support those involved.
- Information on bullying behaviour will be provided to families.
